Dutton Goldfield Syrah – Russian River Valley 2005

Bright Fruit, ripe silky tannins. Deep ruby in color with bright berries and spice in the nose. This vintage is sold out at the vineyard.

Rich aromas of fruit along with dark chocolate, currant and peppery spice flavors. A complex and well structured wine with concentrated flavors and a long finish.

Immense layers of blackberry, black cherry and dark plum with hints of mocha, anise and vanilla. This special reserve has a beautiful medium to full bodied style with perfect flavors.

Exhibits classic fruit and mineral aromas, a rich palate and an extremely lengthy finish. Natural crisp acidity with notes of peach, vanilla and tropical fruit.

Puligny Montrachet – Domaine Bernard Morey et fils. 2004

One of the greatest white wines of Burgundy. This is chardonnay at its finest. Priced at retail!

Louis Jadot Chablis – France 2006

This wine is from the house of Mason Jadot which was founded in Beaune, France in 1859. This wine is a clean and vibrant Chardonnay with excellent minerality which derives from the unique marine soil where the vineyard is. Great choice for those who prefer an un-oaked Chardonnay.

Chateau de Mersault Beaune Premier Cru – France 2003

Packed tannins support layers of dark ripe fruit in this powerfully dry wine. Within the dense fruit and herbal flavor is a fine solid wine. The vineyard is known for its heady wines and this is no exception! 90 pts. Wine Enthusiast.

Jean – Luc Colombo Les Bartavelles – Chateauneuf du Pape 2005

Forward, ripe and easy, with a lot of grape, plum and cherry fruit backed by notes of sweet toast and spice. 89 Wine Spectator.

Chateau Peyre-Lebade – Lustrac, Haut Medoc – France 2002

Fruity and bold with a high percentage of Merlot grapes. This estate dates back to the 13th century when the Cistercian Monks grew grapes here. Odilon Redon the great nineteenth century French painter lived and painted most of his works here. The Rothschild family now owns the estate since 1979. Restored and rejuvenated they now make this



wonderful wine.

Chateau Tour Pibran Pauillac – Franch 2000

Intense fragrant nose of cherries and berries. Moderately smooth tannins and a classic ruby claret from this delightful Bordeaux.
